FOREST (TIMBER AND NON TIMBER PRODUCTS) REGULATIONS, 2008

Regulations made under section 59 of the Forest Act.

1. SHORT TITLE, COMMENCEMENT AND EFFECT

These Regulations: -

- (a) may be cited as the Forest (Timber and non timber products) Regulations, 2008
- (b) shall come into effect on the date of their publication in the *Gazette*;

2. INTERPRETATION

In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, --

“the Act” means the Forest Act, 2008;

“burning permit” means a permit issued under Regulation 26 to burn on Crown Land or within 1000 feet of the boundary with Crown Land;

“Forestry Fee Schedule” means the Forestry Fee Schedule issued under Regulation 11;

“fire hazard period” means a period declared by the Minister under Regulation 26;

“importation permit” means a permit issued under Regulation 18 to import saws and milling equipment or any other equipment that can be converted to saw or mill;

“operator’s licence” means a licence issued under Regulation 22 to operate saws and milling equipment;

“sawmill” means a mill designed and use to break down and covert logs or cants into boards, planks, posts, scantlings or wood products suitable for further processing, and includes a sawpit,

“saws and milling equipment includes--

- (a) chain saws and parts thereof;
- (b) sawmills, include portable mills, Alaskan mills and parts thereof;
- (c) any other equipment that can be converted or used for cutting abstracting, harvesting or milling timber or other forest produce

“timber transport permit” means a permit issued under Regulation 15 to transport or convey timber or other forest produce;

“visitor permit” means a permit issued under Regulation 17 to visit Crown Land;

“woodcutting licence” means a licence issued under Regulation 14 to cut timber or other Forest produce.

3. GRANT OF CONCESSIONS

Concessions to cut timber or extract forest produce may either be put up for tender or auction or may be granted by the Chief Forest Officer on conditions approved by the Minister.

4. GRANT OF LICENCES

Licences to cut timber or extract forest produce may be granted at the discretion of the Chief Forest Officer.

5. PROCEDURE WHERE APPLICANT IS ILLITERATE

Where the applicant for any licence or permit issued under these Regulations is illiterate or unable to fill out the required forms for any reason, the forest officer shall assist the applicant in filling out the required form and shall certify the signature or mark of the applicant.

6. NON-TRANSFERABILITY

All licences and permits issued under these Regulations are non-transferable except with the written permission of the Chief Forest Officer.

7. PROCEDURE WHERE FORESTRY FEE IS TO BE PAID ACCORDING TO GIRTH MEASUREMENT

- (1) If the Forest Officer recommends the issue of a licence in Form 3 where a forestry fee is to be paid according to girth measurement, he shall inspect, measure, and stamp with the Government Sale Marking Die the

trees applied for, in the presence of the licensee or his agent and shall record their description and girth measurement together with his recommendation for a licence.

(2) **PROCEDURE WHERE FORESTRY FEE IS TO BE PAID ACCORDING TO CUBICAL MEASUREMENT.**

If the Forest Officer recommends the issue of a licence in Form 3 where a forestry fee is to be paid according to cubical measurement or according to number where shingles are being worked he shall stamp with the Government Sale Die such as trees or remnants of such trees as he considers necessary and shall record their particulars together with his recommendation for a licence.

(3) **PROHIBITION AGAINST CUTTING**

No trees or timber stamped under this regulation shall be cut or worked until a licence has been issued.

8. **NATURE OF TREE OR TIMBER TO BE CUT**

No tree or timber shall be cut under a licence in Form 1 with forestry fee paid according to girth measurement or according to number where shingles are being worked unless it be dead, wind-fallen, diseased, unsound or a remnant or unless the length or workable stem is less than 24 feet. All other trees must be paid for by cubic measurement, save where specially authorised by the Chief Forest Officer for subcultural reasons.

9. **FORESTRY FEES TO BE PAID BEFORE DELIVERY OF LICENCE**

All forestry fees payable under licences shall be paid before such licences are delivered to the licensee or his agent.

10. **CONDITION OF CUTTING TREES OR REMNANTS**

No trees or remnant shall be cut under licence in Form 3 of the First Schedule unless the same has been stamped with the Government Sale marking Die by an Officer duly authorised in that behalf, in the presence of the licensee or his agent, and the girth measurement of every such tree, and the measurement of such remnant shall be recorded on the licence.

11. **MEASUREMENT OF TREES TO BE CUT**

All trees exceeding five feet in girth to be cut under any licence granted under these rules on which forestry fee is calculated according to their girth measurements shall be measured at height of four feet three inches from the

ground. Provided that if the tree has large buttresses its girth may be measured at such height from the ground not exceeding eight feet as represents the junction of the top of the buttress with the trunk, and a note to that effect must be made on the licence form. Trees of less than five feet in girth shall be measured for the calculation of the forestry fee at such lesser height from the ground at which they are to be cut. In all cases where trees are to be cut at a height less than four feet three inches from the ground, the Forest Officer shall make a check measurement at a point below that at which the tree is to be cut, and shall record such measurement on the licence.

12. PRICE AND FEES

- (1) The Chief Forest Officer shall by notice in the *Gazette* fix and periodically revise-
 - (a) the prices for timber and other forest produce;
 - (b) the fees for licences and permits;
 - (c) the forms of applications for licences and permits.
- (2) The Chief Forest Officer shall cause such prices and fees and any revisions to forms of applications to be published in a list known for the purpose of these Regulations as the Forestry Fee Schedule.
- (3) Copies of the Forestry Fee Schedule with all corrections to date shall be kept by the Chief Forest Officer, at every forestry office and at the Treasury where they shall be prominently displayed and made available to the public during office hours for sale at a reasonable price to be determined by the Chief Forest Officer.

13 PAYMENT FOR TIMBER OR OTHER FOREST PRODUCE

- (1) No permit or licence issued under these Regulations is valid unless marked with an official payment stamp.
- (2) The fees for licences and permits issued under these Regulations may be paid at --
 - (a) the Treasury;
 - (b) the office of the Chief Forest Officer;
 - (c) any forestry office designated in writing by the Chief Forest Officer.

- (3) Fees paid at the office of the Chief Forest Officer or at any designated forestry office shall be deposited in the Treasury or any other designated institution forthwith and in no event later than 7 days after payment.

14. WOODCUTTING LICENCE

- (1) No person, except a forest officer under the direction of the Chief Forest Officer, may cut timber or other forest produce on the Crown Lands without a woodcutter licence.
- (2) The Chief Forest Officer or any other forest officer authorized in writing by the Chief Forest Officer may, at his discretion and consistent with the applicable forest management plan, issue woodcutting licences.
- (3) All woodcutting licences shall be in the form set out in Form 1 of the First Schedule.
- (4) A woodcutting licence shall be valid for a period not exceeding 6 weeks and after that period, the applicant must apply for a new licence.
- (5) A woodcutting licence is not valid on weekends or holidays unless authorized by the Chief Forest Officer.

15. TIMBER TRANSPORT PERMIT

- (1) Pursuant to section 6 of the Act, no timber or other forest produce may be transported or conveyed by any means, including carrying, animal, cart or motorized vehicle, along any public road or path or by water without a timber transport permit.
- (2) The Chief Forest Officer or any other forest officer authorized by the Chief Forest Officer may at his discretion and consistent with the forest management plan, issue timber transport permits.
- (3) All timber transport permits shall be in the form set out in Form 4 of the First Schedule.

16. REFUSAL OF WOODCUTTING LICENCES AND TIMBER TRANSPORT PERMITS

When an application for woodcutting licence or timber transport permit is refused, the Chief Forest Officer or designated forest officer shall record on the form the reasons for the refusal.

17. VISITOR PERMITS AND FEES

- (1) The Chief Forest Officer may require permits and set fees for visits to --
 - (a) Crown land, including forest reserves, nature reserve, protected forest, wildlife reserves, and national parks under this jurisdiction.
 - (b) any other areas of land placed under the management and control of the Chief Forest Officer.
- (2) The amount of such fees shall be set out in the Forestry Fees Schedule.
- (3) The Chief Forest Officer may impose such restrictions on visitation to Crown Land and other areas of land placed under his management and control consistent with the forest management plan, he considers necessary for-
 - (a) the safety of visitors;
 - (b) the protection of flora and fauna;
 - (c) protection or safety of water supply.

18. IMPORT PERMITS

- (1) No person may import or attempt to import saws and milling equipment or any other equipment that can be converted or used to saw or mill, without an import permit issued by the Chief Forest Officer.
- (2) The Minister, on the advice of the Chief Forest Officer, may impose, for a period up to 3 years at the time, a ban on the importation of saws and milling equipment and during the period of such a ban, the Chief Forest Officer shall not issue any importation permits.
- (3) All importation permits shall be in the form set out in Form 5 of the First Schedule.
- (4) No saws or milling equipment shall be released from customs without the presentation of an import permit.
- (5) The Chief Forest Officer shall set out the fee for an import permit in the Forestry Fee Schedule.

- (6) All saws and milling equipment shall be registered with the Chief Forest Officer at the time that the import permit is issued and thereafter shall be subject to annual registration under regulation 19.

19. SAWS AND MILLING EQUIPMENT REGISTRATION AND FEES

- (1) Any person owning saws and milling equipment shall register such saws and milling equipment with the Chief Forest Officer and shall pay any annual registration fee fixed by the Chief Forest Officer and set out in the Forestry Fee Schedule.
- (2) All registration of saws and milling equipment shall be in form set out in Form 6 of the First Schedule.

20. PERMIT TO BUY PARTS AND ATTACHMENTS

- (1) No person may purchase parts or attachments for saws and milling equipment without a permit issued by the Chief Forest Officer in writing.
- (2) All permits to purchase parts or attachments for saws and milling equipment shall be in the form set out in Form 7 of the First Schedule.

21. SEIZURE OF UNREGISTERED SAWS AND MILLING EQUIPMENT

The Chief Forest Officer or any forest officer designated by the Chief Forest Officer may --

- (a) seize and store any unregistered saws and milling equipment;
- (b) impose on any person who has not registered any saws and milling equipment a fine not exceeding three times the registration fee for each year that the saws and milling equipment were not registered, plus the reasonable cost of the seizure and storage of the chain saw and milling equipment;
- (c) sell, and deposit in Treasury the proceeds of sale, of any saws and milling equipment that are seized under this regulation and for which the registration fees are not paid within 3 months of seizure.

22. OPERATOR'S LICENCES

- (1) No person shall operate any saws and milling equipment without an operator's licence.
 - (a) A chain saw operator trainee must be supervised by a licenced operator when operating a chain saw.
 - (b) A licenced chain saw operator must register the name of his assistant.
- (2) An operator's licence shall be in the form set out in Form 8 of the First Schedule.
- (3) The Chief Forest Officer shall, before issuing an operator's licence, set out at his office standards for the applicants in respect of-
 - (a) safety in operation of saws and milling equipment;
 - (b) proficiency in the operation of saws and milling equipment;
 - (c) knowledge of the value of forests, forest produce and wildlife.
- (4) The Chief Forest Officer shall refuse to issue an operator's licence to an applicant who-
 - (a) does meet the standard set in subregulation (3)
 - (b) has been convicted of an offence under the Act or these Regulations in the last five years;
 - (c) is less than 18 years old;
 - (d) has an assistant less than 16 years old.

23. DECLARATION OF ENDANGERED SPECIES OF TREES AND PLANTS

- (1) The Chief Forest Officer may, by notice published in the *Gazette*, declare any species of tree or plant an endangered species, where that species is threatened with extinction or a rapid decline in numbers.

- (2) No woodcutting licence or timber transport permit shall be issued in respect of any endangered species of tree, except where an individual tree may be endangered of life or property.

24. FIRE CONTROL IN FORESTS

- (1) The Chief Forest Officer shall be responsible for the prevention and control of fires on Crown Land.

- (2) Any person who, whether intentionally or negligently, -

- (a) starts a fire on Crown Land or Forest Reserve;

- (b) starts a fire outside of Crown Land or Forest Reserve or Protected Area which spreads to Crown Land, Forest Reserve or Protected Area,

shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars or a term of imprisonment of not more than two years or both.

25. FIRE HAZARD PERIOD

The Minister may in consultation with the Chief Forest Officer declare that during such period as the Minister may prescribe no fire shall be set in specified parts of the state.

26. BURNING PERMITS

- (1) Any person who desires to start a fire on Crown Land shall apply for a permit to the Chief Forest Officer in writing, and the Chief Forest Officer shall inspect such land or cause it to be inspected by a designated officer and may, after such inspection has been made, grant a permit to set fire to such land or any part thereof.

- (2) A fire permit shall be in the form set out in Form 9 of the First Schedule.

27. TRAVEL IN FOREST RESERVE

Every person using or travelling in any forest reserve shall, upon request give the Chief Forest Officer information as to his name, address, routes to be followed, location of camps and any other information pertaining to the protection of the forest reserve; and any such person who refuses to give such information is guilty of an offence.

28. APPEALS

Any person aggrieved by the decision of the Chief Forest Officer not to issue a licence or permit under these Regulations may, within 21 days of a receipt of notification of that decision, appeal the decision to the Minister whose decision shall be final.

29. LICENCES AND PERMITS PRODUCED ON DEMAND

All licences and permits issued under these Regulations shall be produced on demand to any forest officer.

30. CANCELLATION OF LICENCE ETC. ON BREACH OF ANY REGULATION

Breach of any of these Regulations or the conditions of any licence granted under them shall render any such licence liable to cancellation in addition to a forfeiture of all claims to timber or forest produce cut, collected or extracted under such licence.

31. GENERAL OFFENCES

Any person contravening any of the provisions of these Regulations, for which no specified penalty is described, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to fine not exceeding two thousand dollars or a term of imprisonment of not more than one year or both.

32. RETURN OF EXPIRED LICENCES

Every licence granted under these regulations shall be returned to the Officer who granted the same on its expiry, or on any previous date on which work under it has been completed; and all timber or other forest produce cut, collected or extracted under it that has not been removed under duly authorized removal permit, shall remain the property of the Crown free of all claims unless such licence has been extended by the proper officer. A fee of twenty dollars a week may be charged for any such extension unless otherwise provided in such licence. Every such extension shall commence from the date of expiry of the licence or the date of expiry of any previous extension. Such extension shall be obtained on a certificate of the Chief Forest Officer showing the amount of work remaining to be done under the licence.

33. SCALE OF FEES AND DUES

The fees and dues payable under licences granted under these Regulations shall be those prescribed in the Second and Third Schedule hereto. Provided that where for silvicultural reasons it is desirable of forest produce and in the case of stunted abnormal trees, the fees shall be such as may be fixed by Chief Forest Officer.

34. REPEAL

The Forest, Soil and Water Conservation (Crown Land Forest Produce) Rules are hereby repealed.

1. This licence is not transferable. It may not be sublet nor may the licensee allow any person to work under it on payment to him of any consideration whatsoever.
2. That this licence expires on _____ and must be returned to the Chief Forest Officer whether the whole of the produce has been extracted or not.
3. That the Licensee pays to the sub-Collector at _____ the forestry fee due on all the forest produce to be extracted or collected under this licence before it is issued.
4. That this licence together with every receipt for money paid in respect of it must always be kept with the licence or his agent in the forest while forest produce is being cut, extracted or collected and must be produced on demand of any Chief Forest Officer or member of the Police Force.
5. That the licence only cuts for firewood or rods such green standing trees as are pointed out to him or his agent by the Forest Officer and are stamped with the Government Sale Marking die for this purpose.
6. That all forest produce extracted or collected under this licence must be brought to _____ for inspection and checking and that the licensee shall not move from such place, dispose or consume any of the forest produce until it has been checked on measured by the forest officer and a permit has been duly issued to remove same.

7. That no trees may be felled for the purpose of collecting or extracting “Mahoe”, “Cable”, Lianes”, Seguine”, Mauby”, Tanbark”, or Orchids”. No tree may be cut or injured except branches under three inches in diameter.

8. Breach of any conditions of this licences or of the Regulations under which it is issued renders it liable to cancellation to the forfeiture of all claims to forest produce cut or collected under it.

1. That this licence is not transferable, nor may it be sublet, nor may the licensee allow any person to work under it on payment to him of any consideration whatever.

2. That the licensee only cuts such trees or such remnants as are stamped for cutting under this licence with the Government Sale Marketing Die by the Forest Officer, and before cutting such trees or remnants marks the stamps below the felling point or such portions of the remnants as are to be left over, with his initials in paint or tar in letters not less than three inches high, or with his registered property mark, and with the serial number allotted by the Forest Officer, in such a way that such marks are visible at the expiration of the licence.

3. That no timber cut under this licence shall become the property of the licensee, until all forestry fees and dues payable under it have been paid and until the timber has been removed under a removal permit duly granted for that purpose.

4. That the licensee pay at the Sub-Collectors' Office at _____ at the rates prescribed in the Forest Regulations, the forestry fee due under this licence before it is issued.

5. That the Chief Forest Officer may require that any tree cut under this licence must be sawn into boards, planks or posts at the place where the tree is cut.

6. That this licence together with every receipt for money paid in respect thereof must be kept in the possession of the person in charge of the work in the forest as long as the timber is being cut, converted or removed. It must be produced on demand to any Forest Officer or member of the Police Force, and it must be returned to the Forest Officer on its expiry, or on any previous date on which work under it has been completed.

7. That no timber is removed from the place where any tree or remnant is cut or

worked until the whole of the marketable timber obtainable from such tree or remnant has been cut and paid for, and has been inspected, measured and stamped with the Government Sale Marking Die by the Forest Officer and until a removal permit is issued. No removal permit will be granted until all pieces of timber obtained that exceed half a cubic foot in measurement have been clearly marked by the licensee with his initials in paint or tar with his registered properly mark, and with the serial number of the tree.

8. That this licence must be produced when a removal permit is applied for, in order that the number and date of expiry of the removal permit and the quantity of timber to be removed may be endorsed on it by the officer issuing the removal permit. The date of expiry of the removal permit must not be later than the date of expiry of the licence.

9. That on the expiry of this licence any timber cut under it and left in the forest, shall remain the property of the Crown unless an extension of this licence has on the application of this licensee, be granted. A charge of one dollar per week may be made for any such extension.

10. Breach of condition of this licence of any Forest Regulations under which it is granted renders it liable to cancellation in addition to the forfeiture of all claims to timber cut under it.
